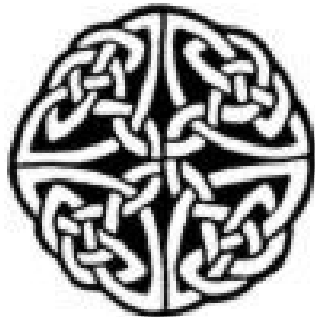

DIRECTIONS to Elms College

**From the Massachusetts Turnpike, Exit 4, West
Springfield:**

Take Route 91 South to Exit 12
Take Route 391 North towards Chicopee

Take Exit 2 (the first exit after leaving Route 91)
At the end of the exit ramp, turn right
onto Center Street, Route 116 North
Go through the traffic light, and take your first
right onto South Street
Proceed up the hill to the next traffic light and
take a right onto Springfield Street
The College will be on your left.

**From Route 91 South or North
Exit 12
Take Route 391 North towards Chicopee.
Follow as above.**

Irish Cultural Center at Elms College

The Irish Cultural Center was the work of Elms former President Kathleen Keating, SSJ, Elms Professor Emeritus Thomas F. Moriarty and Sean Cahillane whose mother was born on the Blasket Island.

The largest number of immigrants to the United States from the Blaskets, famous for their spoken Irish and story telling, settled in Western Massachusetts and Northern Connecticut. Many of them attended a showing in 1997 of Breandán Féirítear's "Blasket Roots, American Dreams" at Elms College.

The Irish Cultural Center at Elms College officially opened in 1999. Since then, its events have ranged from the social to the spiritual to the educational. The Center celebrated its 10th anniversary October 1999 with a weekend of events.
